

## London Conference Constitution

1. The Conference shall ordinarily meet twice annually: for a business meeting in the spring; and for a program meeting in the fall.
2. Those in attendance at a duly constituted meeting shall be considered a quorum.
3. The Conference Council shall ordinarily be elected at the spring meeting of the Conference. All terms shall be for two years. No member shall be eligible to serve for more than three consecutive terms. Only those persons present at the election meeting, or who have clearly indicated their willingness to serve, shall be considered eligible for election.
4. The Conference Council shall consist of the Dean, Secretary-Treasurer, and four other members, at least two of whom must be laypersons.
5. The election for Dean shall be by ecclesiastical ballot. No congregation may have more than one member on Conference Council at a time, unless one of them is the Dean.
6. The Congregational Life Resource Persons of the Conference shall be advisory members of the Conference Council, and are expected to attend the council meetings as requested and to make reports on their ministries and proposals for ministry, etc., to both Conference and Conference Council meetings.
7. The Conference ELW President shall be an advisory member of the Conference Council and shall be invited to report to both the Conference and Conference Council meetings.
8. Amendments to these bylaws may be proposed by:
  - a. The Synod Council
  - b. The Conference Council
  - c. Six delegates, representing at least three congregations.Adoption of an amendment shall require passage at two successive Conference business meetings by two-thirds vote of the delegates present. Such amendments shall be effective upon ratification by the Synod Council.
